-ism Idea, a state, policy


A political idea where the government takes total, centralized state control of every aspect of life

Key Traits	Description
State Control over the Individual	<ul> <li>Demands total obedience to authority and personal sacrifice for the good of the state</li> <li>Denies basic liberties</li> </ul>
Dependence on Modern Technology	<ul> <li>Relies on mass communication (radio, news, loudspeakers) to spread propaganda</li> <li>Builds up advanced military weapons</li> </ul>
Organized Violence	<ul> <li>Uses force, such as police terror, to crush all opposition</li> <li>Targets certain groups, such as minorities and political opponents, as enemies</li> </ul>

"Classless society"	Each social class has their own place and function
Internationalists	Nationalists

# 10 Steps to Dictatorship/Fascism

- 1. Invoke an external and internal threat
- 2. Establish secret prisons/gulags
- 3. Develop a paramilitary force/thug caste
- 4. Surveil ordinary citizens
- 5. Arbitrarily detain and release citizens

# 10 Steps to Dictatorship/Fascism

- 6. Infiltrate citizens' groups
- 7. Target key individuals
- 8. Restrict the press
- 9. Cast criticism as "espionage" and dissent as "treason"
- 10. Subvert the rule of law

# Rise of Totalitarianism



#### Joseph Stalin

Joseph Stalin rose to power after Lenin's death

- Killed rivals to assume power
- Held absolute power of Soviet Union as dictator
- Controlled every aspect of life







#### **Economy and Industry**

Removes Lenin's New Economic Policy in 1928

- Replaces with command economy system
  - Government <u>commands</u> all aspect of the economy
  - Seized control of all aspects of industry and agriculture
- Launches first of a series of Five-Year Plans, starting in 1928
  - Industrial Revolution
  - Agricultural Revolution








"If we are backward and weak, we may be beaten and enslaved. But if we are powerful, people must beware of us. We are 50 to 100 years behind the advanced countries. We must make good this distance in ten years. Either we do it or we shall be crushed."

#### **Economy and Industry (cont.)**

#### Industrial Revolution (1928)

- Impossibly high quotas to increase output of steel, coal, and electricity
- Limited production of consumer goods
- Severe shortages in many necessary goods
- Successfully increased Russian industry, though failed quota




#### **Economy and Industry (cont.)**

#### Agricultural Revolution (1928)

- Collectivization or collective farms formed
  - Millions of private farms seized
- Forced to work in state-owned farms
  - Modern machinery provided
- Fierce resistance from people
  - Resisters, especially kulaks, sent to gulags or executed
- Many starved to death
  - 5 10 million dead
- Did not see positive results until 1938





### The Great Purge (1936 - 1938)

Stalin used the purge to eliminate his enemies and anybody else who stood in his way.

- NKVD, the new Soviet secret police, did his dirty work – execution or Gulag
  - Communist party and government officials
  - Peasants
  - Military leaders
  - Just about anybody for anything

### The Great Purge (1936 - 1938)

- Troika, "a group of three"
  - 3-person commission that issued sentences after simple and speedy investigations without a full trial
    - Quick way to execute or imprison
  - Show trial

#### Solidified Stalin's control over the Soviet Union

- Increased surveillance
- Paramilitary forces
- Limited free speech

600,000 to over 13 million people executed or in Gulags

About 1,000 people executed a day at its height.




















