



Germany (Weimar Republic)

- Article 231 War Guilt Clause
- •\$33 billion in reparation
- Crippled economy
 - Hyperinflation
 - Inflation
 - increase in prices and fall in value of money
- Demilitarization
- Lost territory

During WWI, \$1 USD was worth 4.2 — 7.9 German Marks.

First Half of 1921: \$1 USD = 90 German Marks First Half of 1922: \$1 USD = 320 German Marks December 1922: \$1 USD = 7,400 German Marks November 1923: \$1 USD = 4,210,500,000,000 German Marks!







<u>1922:</u> Loaf of Bread = 163 German Marks



<u>September 1923:</u> Loaf of Bread = 1,500,000 German Marks

<u>November 1923:</u> Loaf of Bread = 200,000,000,000 German Marks!

Economy

- \$33 billion in reparations
 - \$849 billion in 2016 terms
- Did not have enough gold and money to pay
 - Paid in natural resources and raw materials
 - Factories without resources

Military Occupation of Rhineland and Ruhr Valley (1918 — 1919 & 1923 — 1925)


- Demilitarized
- France and Belgium took control of region with military
 - Some Germans killed during protests













Military Occupation of Rhineland and Ruhr Valley (1918 — 1919 & 1923 — 1925)

Nazi Germany on the March, 1936-1939




Dawes Plan (1924)

- Charles D. Dawes (later VP of US)
 - Wanted to make sure Allies can pay back loans to the U.S. from WWI
- Attempted to solve WWI reparations issue
 - Lowered reparation payment, increasing amount
 - Lent Germany money
 - Helped the German economy a bit

Shortened form of "National Socialist"


German version of fascism + racism + antisemitism Hatred/Prejudice against Jews


Adolf Hitler

- German born in Austria in 1889
- Rejected from art school twice
- Volunteered to fight in WWI
 - Praised for bravery
 - Reinforced German nationalism
- Shocked Germany agreed to an armistice in WWI
 - Did not believe Germany lost the war
 - Hated Treaty of Versailles
 - Believed in the "stabbed-in-the-back" myth
 - Marxists, socialists, Jews, etc.

Adolf Hitler


- Continued working in military after WWI because lack of formal education
- Became intelligence agent (spy) in 1919
- Infiltrated German Workers' Party to monitor activities
 - Predecessor of Nazi Party
- Became captivated by to the party's anti-Semitic, nationalist, anti-capitalist, and anti-Marxist ideas
 - Joined the party in 1919
- Adopted swastika as party symbol
- Impressive orator (speaker)







Swastika

- A sacred symbol in Hinduism and Buddhism for "well being" or "good luck"
- Been in used since 200 BCE
- Continues to be a religious symbol in Hinduism and Buddhism







Nazi Party (1920-1945)

- German Workers' Party reestablished as the National Socialist German Workers' Party, or Nazi Party
- Hitler became a rising member and leader
 - Extremely charismatic and great public speaker
- SA (Brownshirts, or Storm Detachment) acted as the armed wing of the Nazi party
 - Protect Nazis
 - Intimidate and commit violence against opponents
 - Later replaced by the SS (Schutzsaffel, Protection Squadron)



Hitler would rehearse his speeches, have them recorded and his picture taken so he can perfect his personality in front of his audience.








Beer Hall Putsch(1923)

- Attempted coup in Munich, influenced by Mussolini's March on Rome (1922)
 - First Munich, then rest of Germany
- Failed and Hitler went to jail, but benefits came out of it
 - Hitler and his ideas became highly publicized
 - Hitler wrote *Mein Kampf ("My Struggles")* in prison
 - His beliefs and blueprint for Nazi party
 - Hitler learned path to power is through legitimate means, not revolution or force
 - Changed Nazi tactics to focus on propaganda to build support




Rise of the Nazi Party

- U.S. stock market crash begins to affect the world in 1929
- Hitler and Nazi Party take advantage to gain support
 - Reject Treaty of Versailles
 - Rebuild economy
 - Create jobs

Does the last two sound familiar?

- Lebensraum, "living space" for Germans
- Hitler gains power legally
 - Becomes chancellor of Germany in 1932
 - 1933 granted near-dictatorship powers by government
 - Begins seizing control government and creating a dicatorship





Reichstag Fire (1933)

- Main government building of Germany
- Four weeks after Hitler was appointed chancellor, a fire occurs in the Reichstag
- Hitler and Nazi Party blamed communists
- President Hindenburg issues Reichstag Fire Decree
 - Emergency powers that suspended civil liberties (speech, public assembly, habeas corpus, etc.) to catch culprits (communists)
- Later Hitler gains dictatorial powers through Enabling Act of 1933
 - Rule by decree






Totalitarian State in Nazi Germany

- Banned all political parties
- SA (brownshirts) replaced by SS
 - Completely loyal to Hitler
 - Arrested and executed Hitler's enemies
- Gestapo (branch of SS), secret police
- Fear and terror controlled the people
- Took control of economy
- Put millions of Germans to work
 - Built factories and other infrastructure
 - Secretly rebuilt German military











Totalitarian State in Nazi Germany


- Hitler becomes known as Führer, "The Leader"
- Children became part of Hitler Youth or League of German Girls
- Censorship and Nazi propaganda to keep control of information and strengthen Nazi power
 - Press, radio, literature, art, film
- Jews, other minorities, enemies of Nazi's persecuted
 - Concentration camps and prisons
- Social Darwinism, building a superior Aryan race


