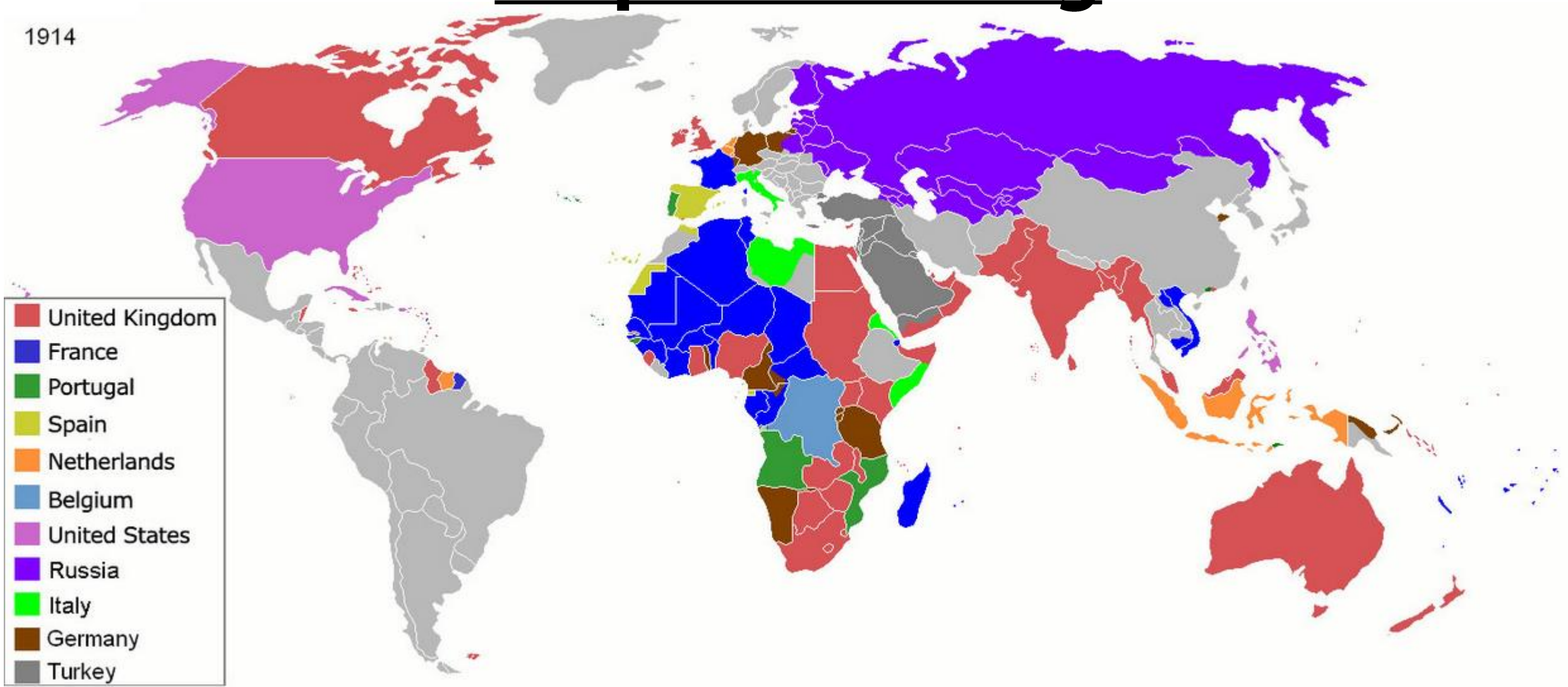

Some reasons include:

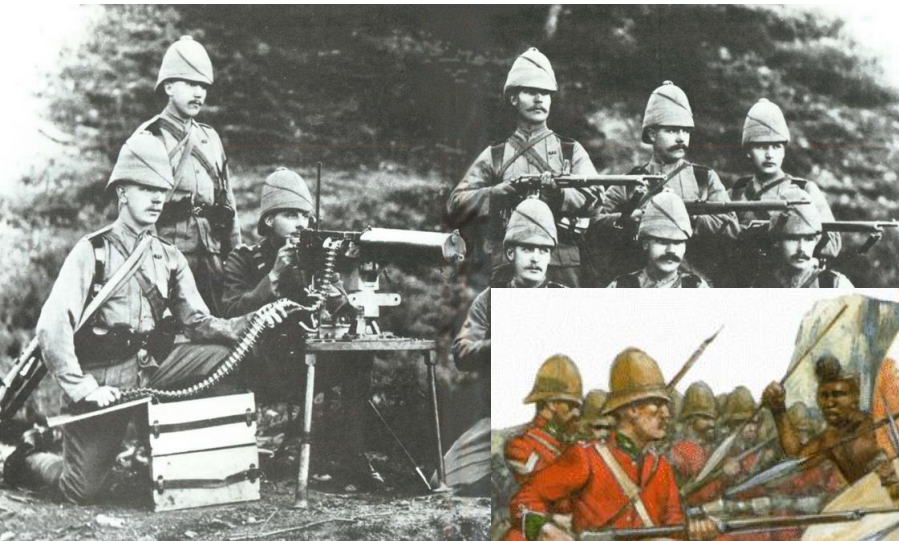
- Capitalism (Industrial Revolution)

- Religion

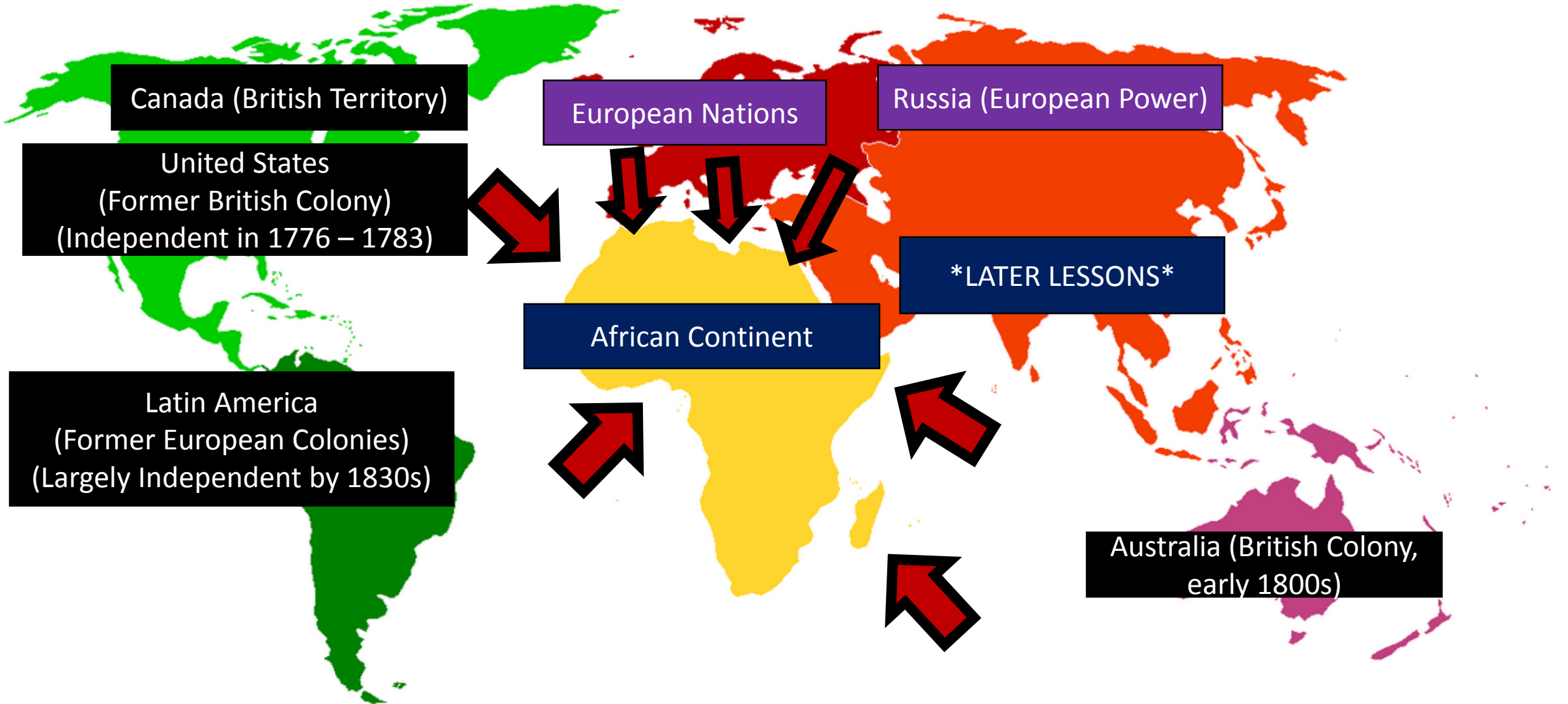

Africa's Vegetation

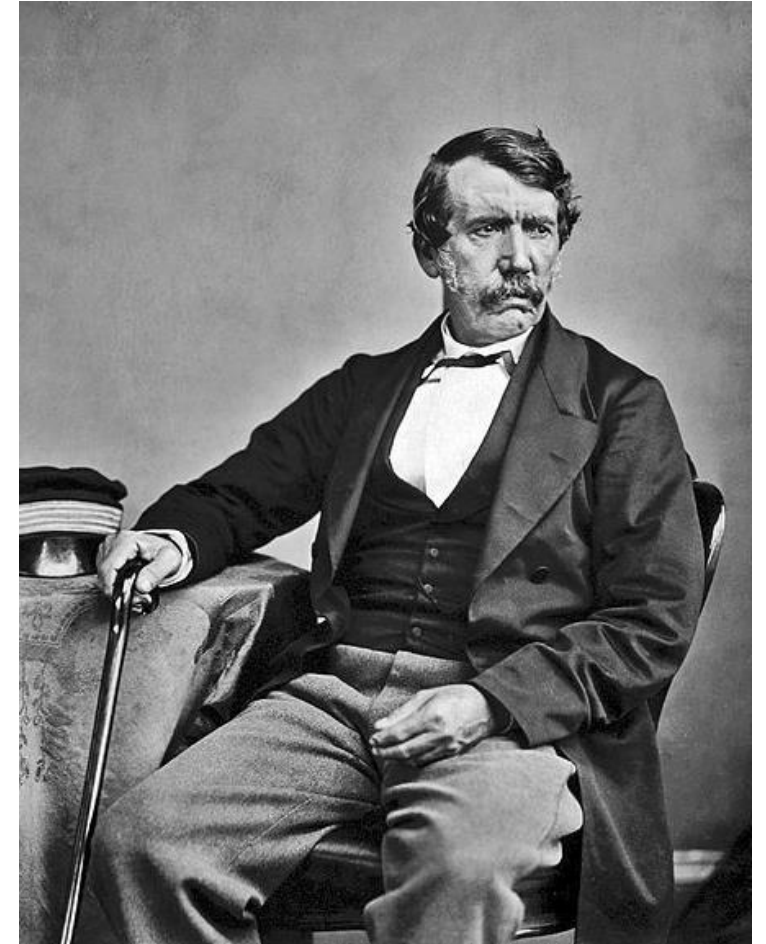


Dr. David Livingstone

- Doctor, explorer, missionary, scientist, reformer
- Wanted to find source of Nile River and disappeared in the 1860s
- Reporter Henry Stanley hired to find him
- Found in 1871 in southeastern Africa
- 1879, Stanley returned, representing Belgium
- By 1880s, European nations started coming in

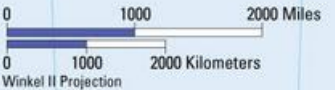


Colonial Claims, 1900

Italy	Independent states in Africa and Asia

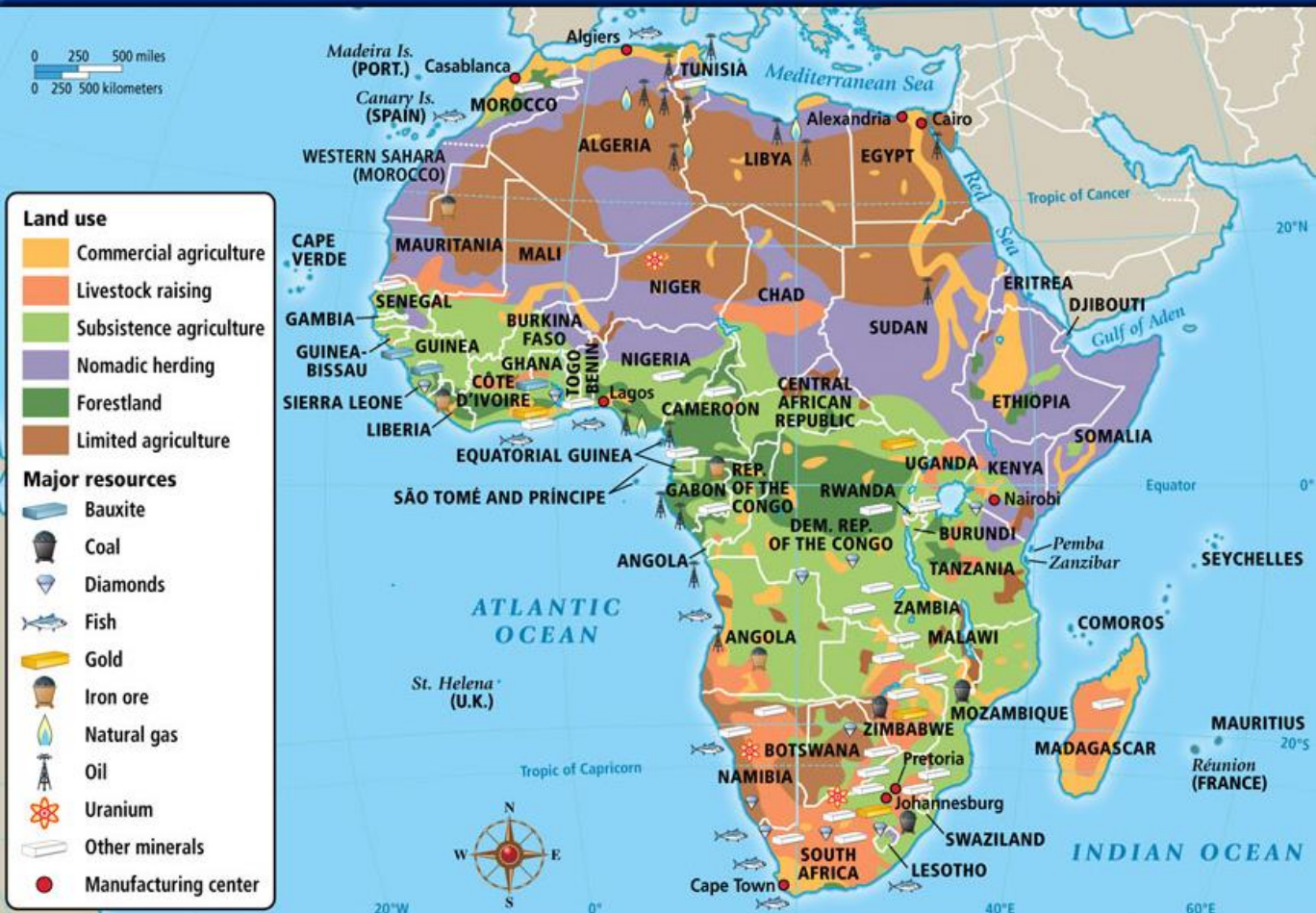

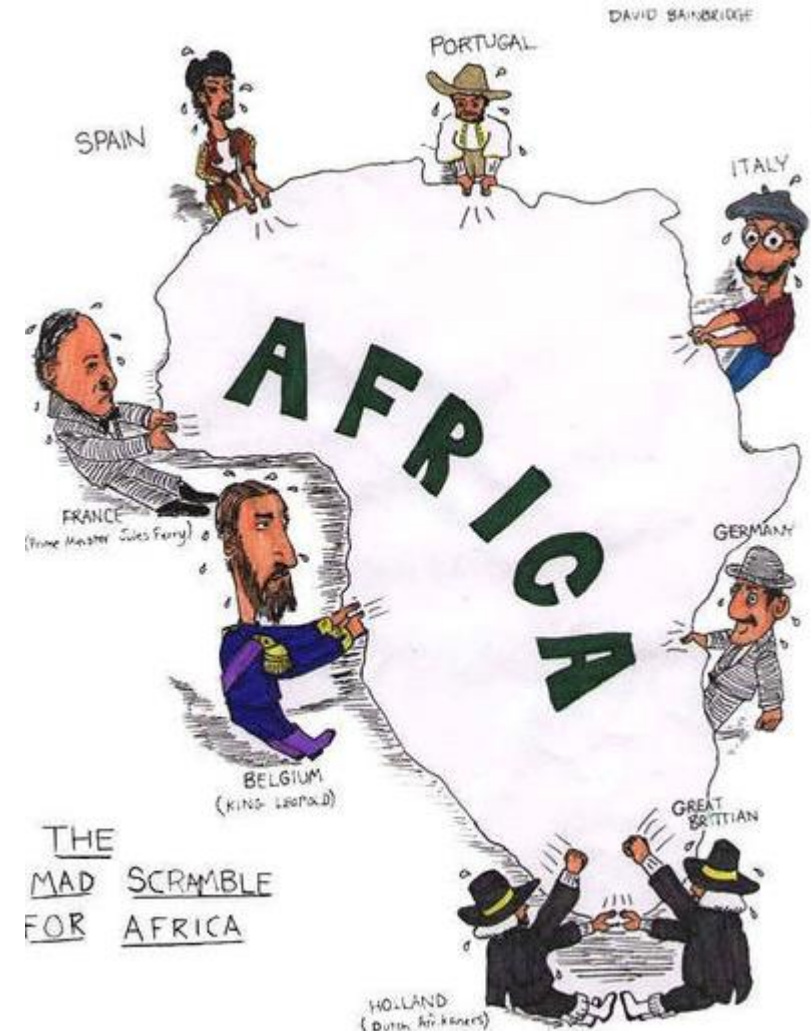


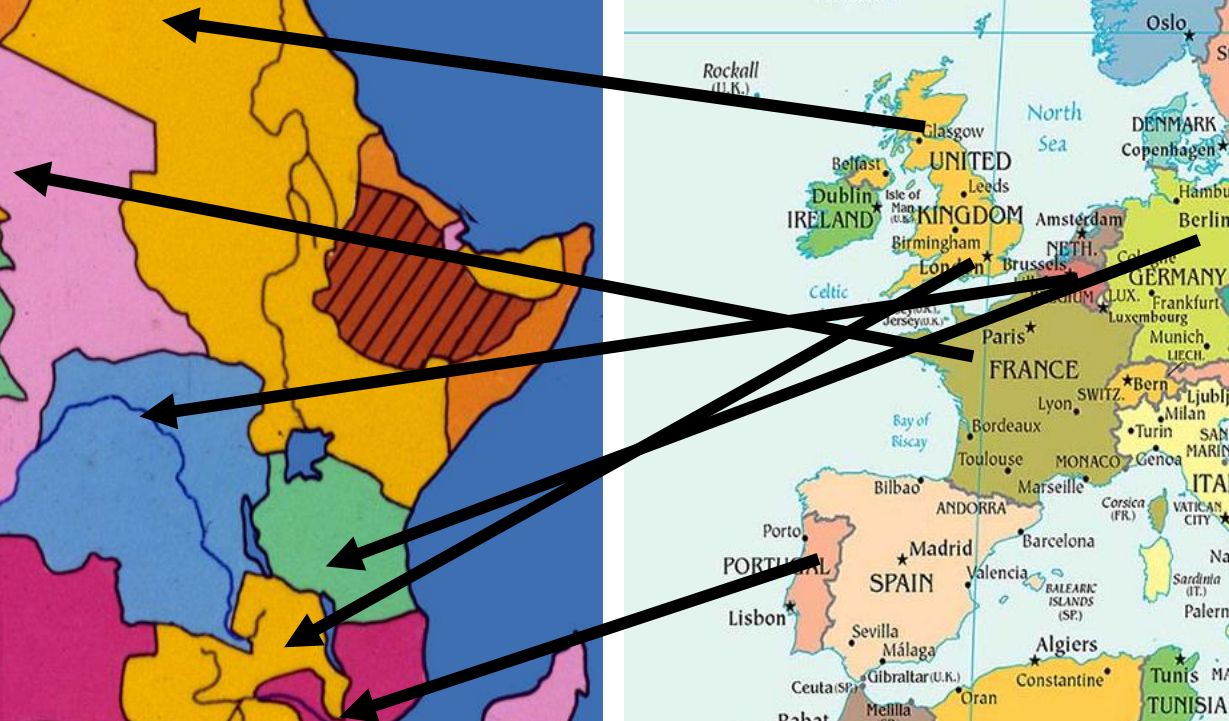
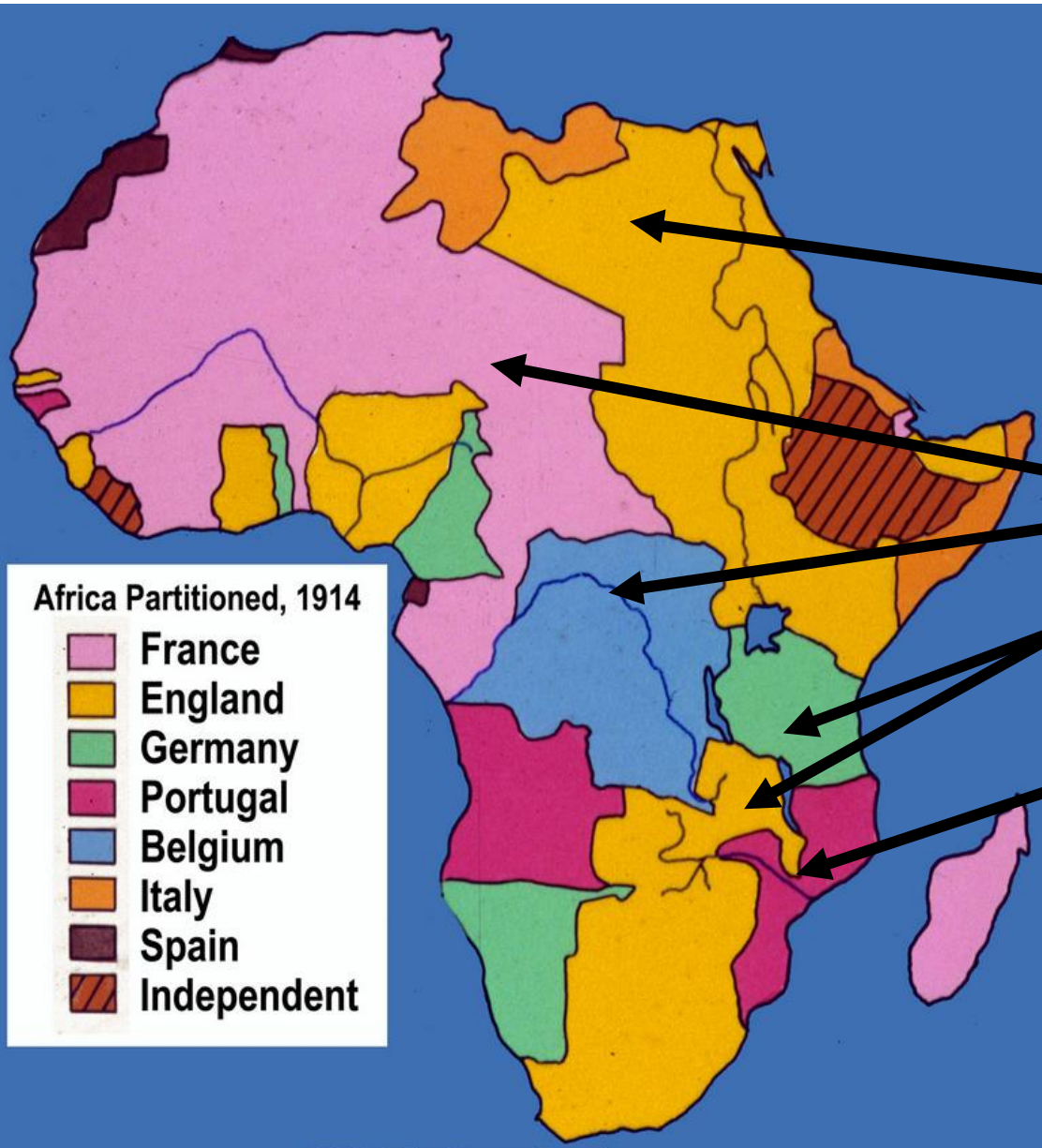
The Scramble for Africa

- Europeans went crazy for land because of resources
- Everybody wanted a piece of the action
- War could have happened

Berlin Conference (1884-1885)

- 14 European countries met
- Peacefully divided Africa as long as they can show they can control the land they want
- NO AFRICAN COUNTRIES REPRESENTED
- No regard for ethnic or linguistic groups
 - Created many issues that still exist today





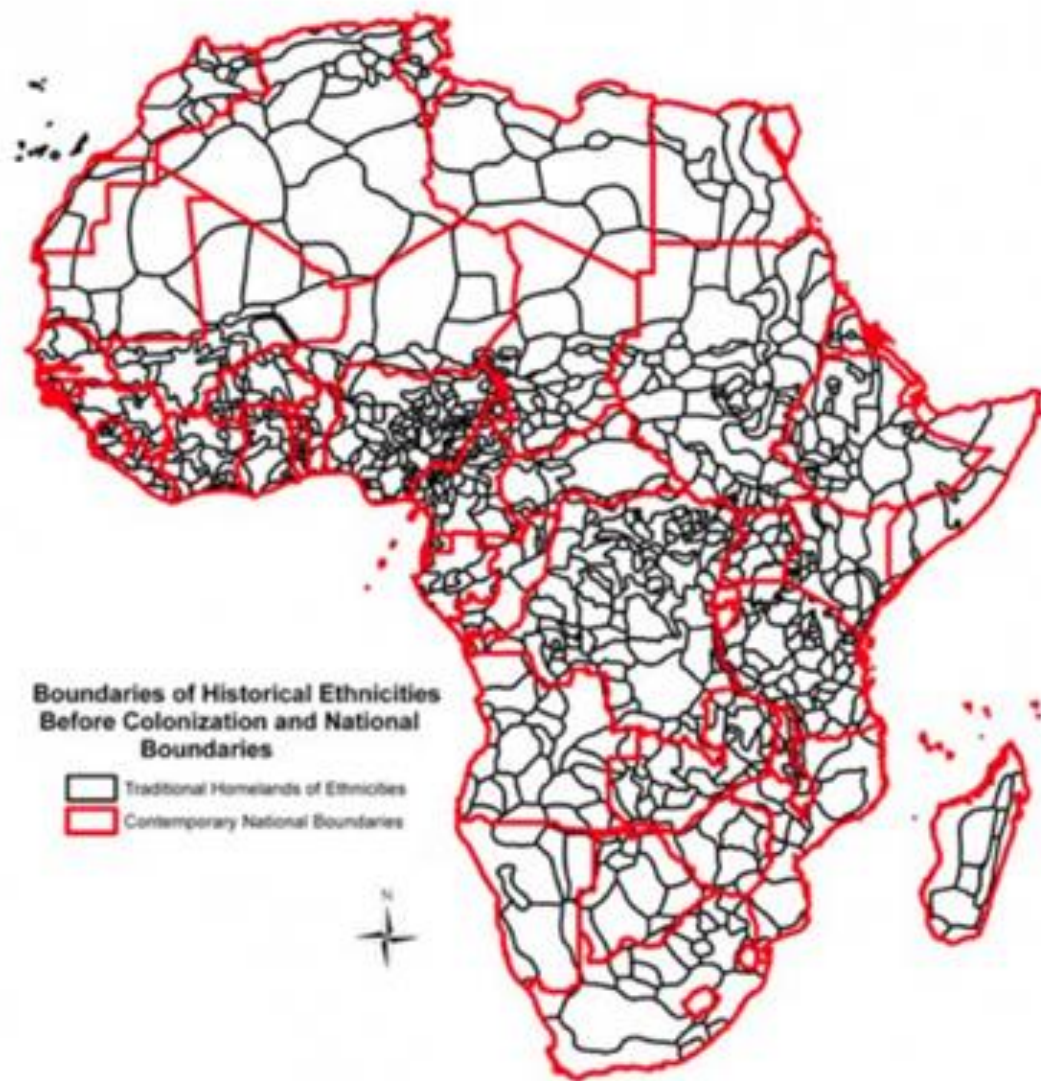
