Public Sphere

- Space where society discusses its issues
 - Community
 - Private sphere
 - Home
- Multiple levels
 - Local
 - National
 - Global








Public Agenda

- To-do list of issues that the public agrees are a priority
 - Depends on the discussions within the public sphere
- Public Spotlight
 - Could be about useless things
 - But can call attention to issues
 - Celebrity using their status to bring attention









Public Opinion


- View that a significant part of the public/population has about an issue
- Polls
 - Sample pool
 - "2/3s of Americans..."
 - Should be critical of sources.



- Influencing Factors
 - Family/Home
 - Culture
 - School
 - Environment
 - Media
 - Etc.

Public Policy

- Position government takes on an issue
 - Becomes guide for action
 - Laws
- Government officials *should* be reflective of constituents' opinion
- Public opinion does not solely dictate public policy
