
The American Empire or American Exceptionalism?

Beginnings — Monroe Doctrine


Remember between 1810s to 1830s, most of Latin American colonies declared independence from Europe

Monroe Doctrine (1823)

James Monroe told Europe to stay away from the Americas

"The American continents...are henceforth not to be considered subjects for future colonization by any European powers

Backed by the British navy





Continental Expansion & Manifest Destiny

Manifest Destiny (1845)

U.S. is special and is destined to expand across the continent

- Louisiana Purchase from Napoleon in 1803
- Annexation of <u>Texas</u> in <u>1845</u>
- Defeated Mexico in Mexican-American War in 1848





Expansion of Manifest Destiny

By the end of the 19th century, the U.S. was expanding its influence across the Pacific Ocean. Some believed Manifest Destiny included expanding beyond the continent.

• In 1867, U.S. bought Alaska from Russia for \$7.2 million (\$121 million in 2015 dollars)

F22 Raptor costs \$150 million each!

- In 1893, American plantation owners with support of U.S. marines overthrew the Kingdom of Hawaii.
- In 1898, the U.S. declared war on Spain (Spanish American War) and won the Philippines, becoming a part of U.S. territory until 1946. And Cuba until 1902. And Puerto Rico







Gunboat Diplomacy

Foreign policy using conspicuous displays of naval power as a threat to force their


demands

In 1853, U.S. sent
 Commodore Matthew Perry
 to Japan and forced Japan
 to open doors (ports)

- In 1907, Great White Fleet.
 16 U.S. battleships & 14,000 sailors circumnavigated the globe
- Big Stick Diplomacy "Speak softly, and carry a big stick."







Open Door Policy

In 1899, the U.S. proposed to European nations that China's "doors" be open to merchants of all nations — free market.

- Protected U.S. trading rights
- Protected China from colonization

Roosevelt Corollary

In 1904, Teddy Roosevelt added it to the Monroe Doctrine, says the U.S. will intervene in conflicts between Latin American and European countries

"International police power"






Involvement in Latin America

If U.S. economic interests did not go their way, they would encourage revolutions to overthrow the Latin American governments and sometimes take over


- Panama Canal from Colombia (1903), finished in 1914, controlled until 1977 (1914 - 1977)
- Cuba had a revolt in 1906. U.S. sent soldiers and ruled it until 1909. (1906-1909)
- Nicaragua Supported rebels to overthrow president in 1909 and controlled it from <u>1912 to</u> <u>1933</u>
- Sent soldiers to northern Mexico to find Pancho Villa (1914 -1917)
- Occupied Haiti from <u>1915 1934</u>
- Occupied Dominican Republic from <u>1916 1924</u>


2013 United States Military Deployments
U.S. soldiers deployed in more than 150 countries around the world in over 700 bases. There are 196 countries in the world. 75% of the world.



US military bases world wide 2001-2003

In this period the United States has over 730 military installations and bases in over 50 countries.

It also has military personnel on active duty in dozens of other countries.


